Traditional emergency funding programs require too much processing time and many businesses won't qualify. Some businesses are too leveraged to consider traditional loans.

We believe in and need our small businesses. For that reason, we devised a solution to offer immediate funds, mentoring and other resources to Colorado Springs small businesses.



RELIEF & RESOURCES

Survive & Thrive COS provides recovery funding, mentoring and other resources to increase the sustainability and future growth of small businesses based in the Pikes Peak region.

Small businesses employing up to two to 25 full-time employees are eligible to receive up to \$25,000 in funding. Additional criteria apply and can be reviewed at exponentialimpact.com.

Installments are provided monthly over three months. Repayment occurs over three years, and payments are not required for the first year. Terms are 0% in year one and increase by 1% over each of the next two years.

More than funding, Survive & Thrive COS believes in supporting not only the financial aspects of businesses but the personal growth of the owners. Survive & Thrive COS participants have access to mentorship, education and tools tailored to their specific business concerns. This unique path supports resiliency, builds community and develops healthy businesses and holistic leaders.

INVESTMENT
